## All Saints Sunday

On November 3 we will celebrate the festival of All Saints. This feast that falls on the first day of November is transferred to the Sunday closest to that date. There are “famous saints” that hold a special place in the church’s memory and they are usually commemorated on the day of their death, but on All Saints Day the church commemorates all deceased Christians. This is a day to give thanks for the whole communion of saints on earth and in heaven. Just so, we will remember those who have crossed the river ahead of us, and especially those members of the congregation who have died in the past year. We celebrate their passage through the door of death into a new life in God’s eternal presence. We will name the FLCWS saints who died this past year.

## Christ the King Sunday

This last Sunday after Pentecost will be November 24<sup>th</sup>. Compared to our festivals that go back to ancient times, this day is relatively new. It was put into place by Pope Pius XI in 1925 as a response to an ever growing ultra-nationalism that preceded the Second World War. It was an attempt to proclaim the true kingdom of God markedly different than the kingdoms of the world. This day is now celebrated ecumenically.
