**Reformation Sunday** is October 26th this year. Over the centuries, Lutherans have kept a special day to thank God for the freedom God’s word grants believers and to pray that with the help of the Holy Spirit, the church will continually be renewed and reformed. Reformation Day began in 1667 on October 31 because on this date in 1517, Luther posted his 95 theses on the church door in Wittenberg. That event marked the beginning of the Reformation that changed the church and much of European culture.



Beginning Reformation Sunday, October 26, the **Adult Formation** will feature a series on the **Nicene Creed**. This is the 1,700th Anniversary of the Creed. The series will focus on why it is important and how it is a force for both unity and disunity. How has this ancient creed separated the Christian East from the Christian West? The forum follows Coffee Fellowship in the lounge.
